

 - > D) Show some willingness as a group to pay if account sharing was cracked down upon.















Across other streaming video platforms they watch, what do their relationships look like?

- Lives With Someone Who Pays For Netflix




How many streaming video services do you think is the right number to be paying for at the same time?







Do you currently subscribe to cable satellite or telco TV?




In an average month, how many hours of Netflix do you watch?



When is the last time you watched something on Netflix?






If Netflix cracked down on account sharing, how likely would you be to pay to subscribe yourself:





"Too much money. I am already considering dropping my Hulu and Prime accounts. Plenty of free options available now"





Now imagine you would not be allowed to select verify later any longer, which would you choose?



Does the person you are sharing an account with know you are using their login?



- I share the costs with the person who shares my account




